Course Description: This course is designed using the Indiana State Board of Health approved curriculum. After successful completion of the course, each participant will be eligible to take the state nursing assistant certification exam and will be eligible in a long-term care setting. After working as a Certified Nursing Assistant for ninety days, the student has the opportunity to become a Home Health Aide. Additional course hours include resume building workshop, job application skills, and mock interviewing skills to further enhance student's education and to build for a successful career in the health field.

Medical Anatomy & Physiology introduces students to the structure and function of systems and subsystems of the human body. The A&P taught in this course has a medical orientation, particularly in preparation for careers in the health care systems. The course covers normal aging and abnormal health conditions.

Medical terminology prepares students with language skills necessary for effective, independent use of health and medical reference materials. It includes an introduction to health and medical abbreviations and symbols. This introduction builds skill in pronouncing, spelling, and defining new words encountered

in verbal and written communications. Students have the opportunity to acquire skills in interpreting medical records and communications accurately.

Anatomy & Physiology and Medical Terminology serve to compliment and mutually reinforce the content learned. While the students learn about body parts and function, they inadvertently acquire Medical Terminology skills. As the student learns medical terms, anatomy and physiology is reinforced. This will serve to help the student to successfully render patient care as a nursing assistant.
